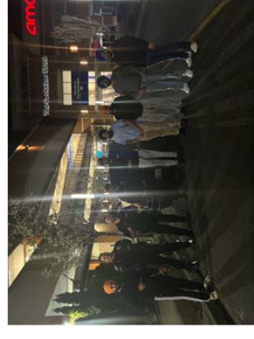

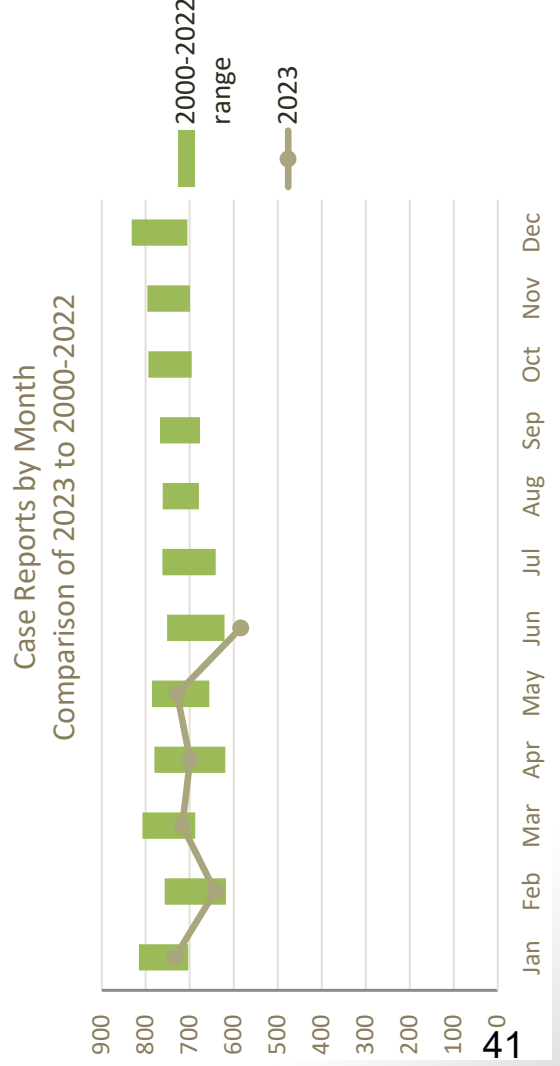
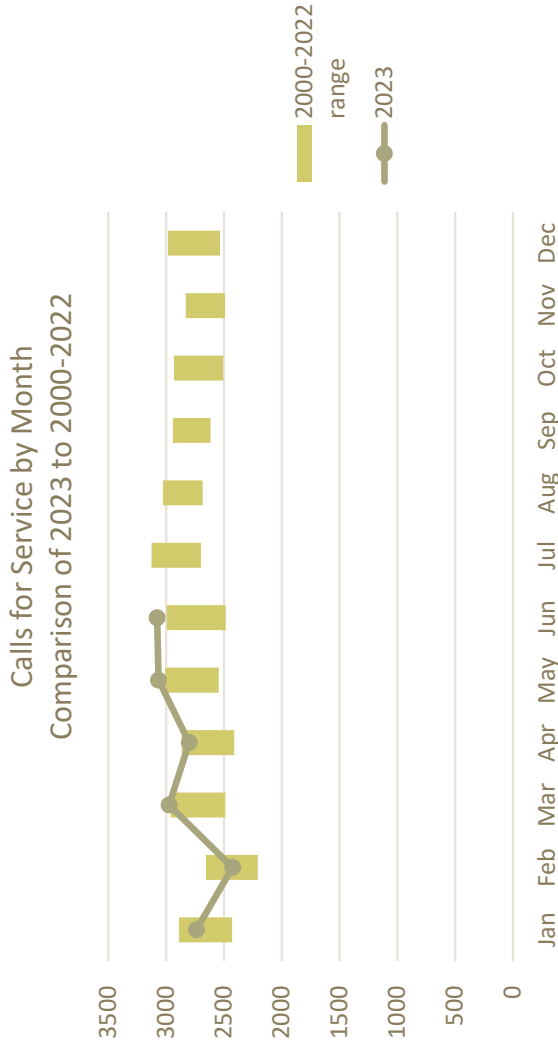


SECOND QUARTER CRIME STATISTICS

Calls for service are just slightly higher than previous years.

Case reports (online and officer-created) show a distinct decrease in June, but this report was completed closer to the end of the month. Many cases have not yet been completed and processed.
